


What is Information **Disclosure**? Objectives of Information Disclosure Efficacy of Information Disclosure

- Stop Wasting the Money

In case of failure, lawsuits are filed by citizens




3. Japan Citizens' Ombudsman Association

- Early 1990s: Nagoya Sendai Tokyo
- In 1994, the activity has spread nationwide: General Investigation and Pursuing Nationwide Corruption
- •Now, there are 85 organizations with 6,000 members.
- •We do not rely on government subsidy or trust fund.
